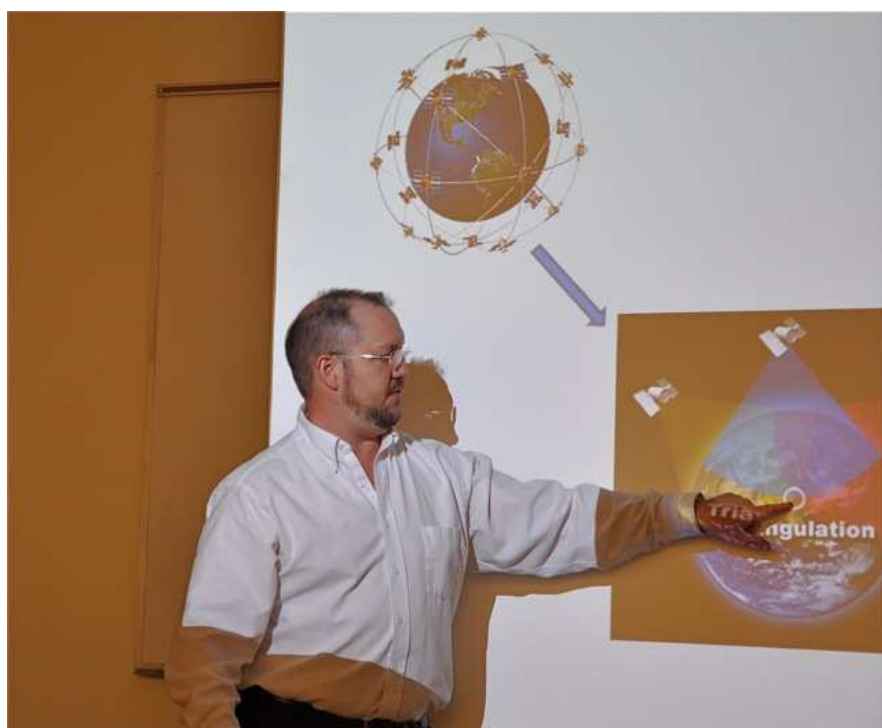

The Way We Hear It

Crystal oscillators, an old technology, are holding their own against newer devices such as microelectromechanical systems (MEMS) oscillators. Quartz crystals are inexpensive, stable and rugged. They came into wide use in the 1920's and still provide the frequency control in virtually all ham and commercial radio equipment.
