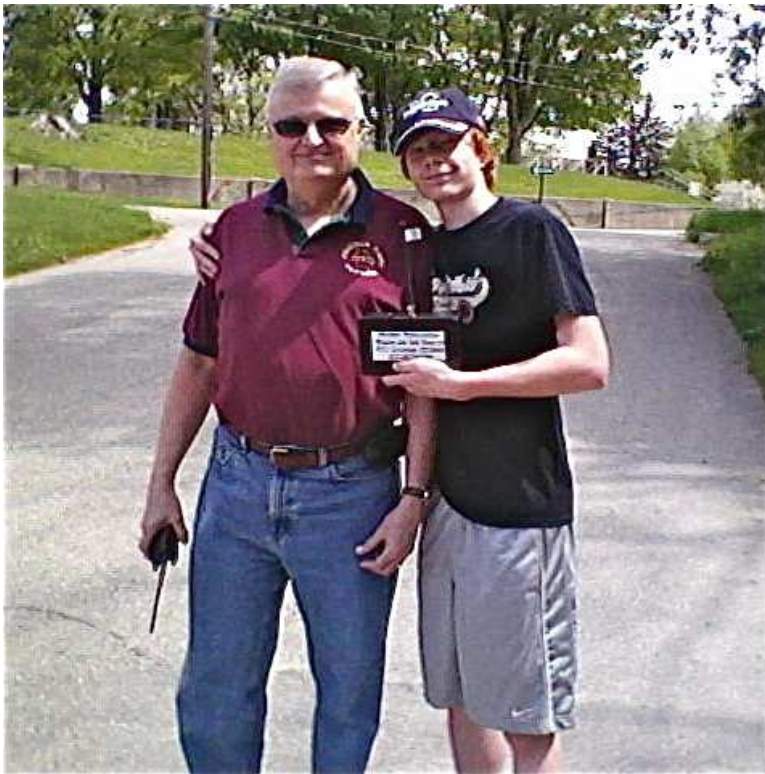
This Issue's Brain Teaser
